Summary of the Event

- A silent auction featuring artwork donated by local artists. We ask that no piece be larger than roughly 10"x10". There is no requirement to frame artwork. The LHS will have canvases available for those who need one.
- All media: paintings, photographs, collages, mixed media, fabric, jewelry, etc. are welcome!
- Only one work or collection of work per artist, to ensure space for all who participate.
- Works of all shapes are encouraged, so long as they stay within the 10"x10" guidelines.
- To encourage multiple bids, all works will start at \$50 with minimum bid increments of \$25.
- This event typically draws between 150 and 200+ people; it is a great opportunity to showcase your work to the community!
